OR27: Surface Preservation and Scenic Bikeway Improvements

- **Description:** Roadway resurfacing and extending pavement south to Salt Creek Rd (MP 25.81 – 28.33). Pave entrance aprons to popular BLM campgrounds along OR27/Crooked River Canyon
- **Project Type:** Preservation / Capital Improvements
- **Federal Partners:** BLM, Bureau of Reclamation

OR242: Roadway Widening and Pavement Preservation

- **Description:** Widen lanes and shoulders to standard and overlay pavement (MP 77.5 – 792.03). Extend shared-use path from McKinney Butte Rd to Sisters city limits (MP 90.7 – 91.1).
- **Project Type:** Preservation / Capital Improvements
- **Federal Partner:** USFS – Deschutes National Forest

OR380: Shoulder Widening and Pavement Preservation

- **Description:** Add shoulders and rehabilitate pavement (overlay, rebuild edges, and shoulders), MP 0.00 – 55.90.
- **Project Type:** Preservation
- **Federal Partners:** BLM, USFS – Ochoco National Forest

US20: Sisters to Bend Multi-Use Trail

- **Description:** Add a parallel multi-use trail along portions of US20 (from Bend to Sisters). Existing county roads could provide bike connections parallel to US20, but the multi-use trail would fill in where there are gaps.
- **Project Type:** Pre-NEPA Planning
- **Federal Partner:** USFS – Deschutes National Forest

US26: Warm Springs Multi-Modal Improvements

- **Description:** Construct Phase 2 shared-use path segments along the south side of US26, connecting Warm Springs residents across Shitike Creek and the Deschutes River to BLM and OPRD recreation areas on the east side of the Deschutes River. Construct additional safety and traffic improvements (crosswalks, ADA, etc.) to improve access and safety to BLM and OPRD recreation areas on the east side of the Deschutes River, as well as to federal recreation areas in Mt. Hood National Forest.
- **Project Type:** Enhancements / Capital Improvements
- **Federal Partner:** BLM

US97: Sunriver to La Pine Shared-Use Path

- **Description:** Create a paved path between Sunriver and La Pine.
- **Project Type:** Pre-NEPA Planning
- **Federal Partner:** USFS – Deschutes National Forest
